

1. Whereas the Directorate had issued DGS Training Circular No. 12 of 2020 dated 01 / 04 / 2020 stating the minimum eligibility criteria for admissions in pre-sea maritime courses and introduced “Common Entrance Test” (CET) and “Online Counseling”.
2. Whereas para 12.3 of the said Training Circular dealt with “Online Counseling” which would be common to all Maritime Training Institutes.
3. Whereas as per Annexure – 1 of the said Training Circular, candidates seeking lateral entry for admission in second year of the four-year Marine Engineering Degree course (BE / B-Tech Marine Engineering) were required to qualify in the online “Common Entrance Test” (CET).
4. Whereas the ongoing COVID – 19 pandemic caused disruptions in the education system across the Country leading to unprecedented uncertainties.
5. The Director General of Shipping, Government of India has decided to make the following amendments to the DGS Training Circular No. 12 of 2020 dated 01 / 04 / 2020.
 - 5.1. The “Online Counseling” shall not be applicable for the academic year 2020 – 2021. The Maritime Training Institutes may follow their own

counseling methodology based on the CET rank list. The online counseling for the 6 IMU campuses shall however be applicable as per the Indian Maritime University (IMU) norms.

- 5.2. It shall not be mandatory for the candidates seeking lateral entry for admission in second year of the four-year Marine Engineering Degree course (BE / B-Tech Marine Engineering) to qualify in the online "Common Entrance Test" (CET) for the academic year 2020 – 2021.
6. This Training Circular comes in to force with immediate effect.
7. This issue with the approval of the Director General of Shipping, Government of India.
